Health Information Exchange Adoption Summit: Beyond EHRs



Thank you to those who attended the HIE Summit on April 17 at the Genesee Grand Hotel. We had an incredible turnout of 135 participants and stakeholders who heard presentations from Dr. Roberto Martinez (NYSDOH), Paul Wilder (NYeC), and Rob Hack (HealtheConnections) followed by a panel discussion led by Karen Romano.

Dr. Martinez and Wilder communicated the importance of patients, providers, public health, and payers connecting to the HIE, as no single entity can provide all of the necessary tools to improve the care that patients receive. They stressed that with all of these entities working together, the HIE can be used effectively to improve the quality of care and patient satisfaction with a long-term goal of having state-wide connectivity.

In the HealtheConnections presentation, Hack covered the objectives for 2013 including the transfer to a new system, Mirth, which will take place in the upcoming months. The new system will make it easier for users to navigate patient records. For those practices that are not yet hooked up to the HIE, the presentation touched on the practicalities of and necessity for switching to EHRs and connecting with other practices.

After a short break, participants were addressed by a panel comprised of two practice administrators and a director, all of whom are currently using EHRs and the HIE to share patient data quickly and efficiently.

How to Attain Meaningful Use Stage 2

Eligible professionals (EPs) and hospitals need to successfully attest to demonstrating meaningful use of certified electronic health records (EHRs) to qualify for an incentive payment through the Medicare EHR Incentive Program administered by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). EPs and hospitals that are eligible for the Medicaid EHR Incentive Program do not need to attest to meaningful use in their first year of participation, but must adopt, implement or upgrade to an EHR to receive an incentive payment from their State.

What Providers Need to Know about EHR Audits



All eligible professionals (EPs), eligible hospitals and critical access hospitals (CAHs) attesting to receive an incentive payment for either the Medicare or Medicaid Electronic Health Record (EHR) Incentive Program may be subject to an audit.
